CANCER survivor **Sam Newman** has paid tribute to a Sony Foundation event that raises funds for a youth cancer program.

The *Footy Show* star was part of the celebrity crowd attending the River4Ward lunch, raising money for You Can, at Crown Riverwalk yesterday.

Singers **Dami Im**, **Jessica Mauboy**, **Isaiah Firebrace**, **Daryl Braithwaite** and **Anthony Callea** performed at the event.

"It's extremely important to support this event because the knock-on effect of people who have cancer spreads to family, relations and friends. It's a community problem," said Newman, who beat cancer seven years ago.

He added: "Within 10 days of finding out I had prostate cancer, I had my prostate removed. Much to the chagrin of many people, I'm still here."

Reality star **Jackie Gillies** said her husband, silverchair drummer **Ben Gillies**, was working on new music, despite his lawsuit against a fitness centre.

In a writ lodged in the County Court, Gillies says he was seriously injured while training, and claims he's been unable to drum for eight months, and is still partially incapacitated.

"The lawyers have been dealing with it. That's all I can say," Jackie said. "Ben is a strong person, Ben gets through everything and, at the end of the day, Ben is writing a new record as we speak. He's doing what he loves and he'll never give that up."
